### EVERYDAY PREVENTIVE STEPS for COLD/FLU/VIRUS SEASONS

- If you are sick, stay home -- except to get medical care.
- Wash your hands often with soap and warm water for at least 20 seconds. Wet your hands and apply soap. Lather your hands – including the back, between your fingers and under your nails. Scrub hands for 20 seconds. To time 20 seconds, you can sing "Happy Birthday" twice or "Zip-a-Dee-Doo-Dah" once. Then rinse.
- Use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with 60-70% alcohol if soap and water are not available. Make your own: 2/3 cup alcohol plus 1/3 cup aloe vera gel. Add a few drops of essential oil.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces in your home and car. You
  may also want to clean your desk surface and computer keyboard/mouse at work. Bring
  sanitizing wipes with you to restaurants, stores that use shopping carts, etc.
- Cover your coughs and sneezes with a tissue, your sleeve, or your elbow.
- Avoid touching your face.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
